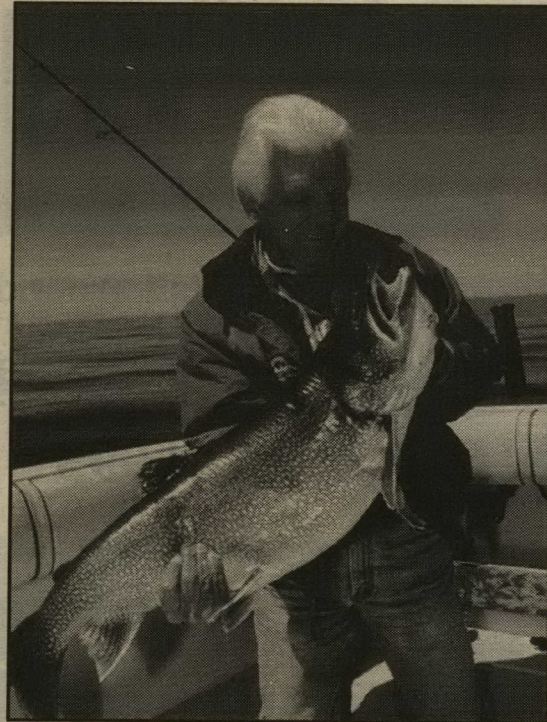
The Woods-N-Water News is recognized as the Michigan's largest outdoor newspaper and is an independent monthly publication for the sportsmen.
